Taught completely in Spanish, we will focus on building competency in each of the macro-skills of language– listening, speaking, reading, writing, viewing, and interpreting.

ASSESSMENT/GRADING

Evaluation of the student will be a balance of formative and summative assessments to provide ongoing feedback for student improvement. This includes: Notebook, Daily Engagement Assessment, Duolingo practice, Projects, Quizzes and Free Writes.

DUOLINGO: To become fluent in Spanish, it is important to practice the language outside the classroom too. Students will join Sra. Campuzano's class through the

Duolingo's App. They will be



able to use any mobile device, computer or tablet to sign in. I will assign the students different modules a week or every two weeks. This sections will count towards their final grade.

4 tips to learn a new language:

1.**Listen to music:** Dancing the cha-cha to waltz music in Spanish. Even if you are just a beginner and barely know any words, you can still practice pronunciation and fluency.

2. Listen to a radio station: you'll hear familiar words repeated and will learn to distinguish them.

3. Watch television: Even without knowing all the words, you will be able to get the gist of some of the news reports. The images and video footage of events already tell you what the news announcers are talking about. Tune into HOW they are speaking and the words they are using to describe the images on screen.

4. Find the original version of movies in Spanish. You can find movies in Spanish on Netflix and at your local library. :)
