Casa San Ysidro Field Trip

On Wednesday, March 7 the seventh and eighth graders visited Casa San Ysidro in Corrales. It was built circa 1875, and was named for the original owners (the Gutierrez family) and the couple (the Minges) who purchased and restored the property. Inside Casa San Ysidro are the furnishings, tools, and art used when New Mexico was a remote frontier. They had wonderful guides who guided their tour. In addition, they showed them how to make tin art which they brought back as a memento of the trip.
